This letter contains information for the opening of school on Thursday, September 5th, 2019.

In preparation for the 2019-2020 school year, our amazing Building and Grounds staff have been working tirelessly throughout the summer to prepare the buildings and grounds. Our school looks great and we cannot thank them enough for all their hard work!

First Day of School- School will open on Thursday, September 5, 2019 for all students at Sayreville War Memorial High School. The first day is a full day from 7:30 am to 2:12 pm. Lunch will be available or students may bring a lunch from home. The High School lunch price is \$3.60. Upon arrival at school, the students should report to their Period 1 class **no later than 7:25 am**.

Student Schedules/Enrollment Update - If you have not already done so please complete and submit your child(ren)'s enrollment update in *Oncourse Connect*. A copy of your child's schedule can be accessed via the Oncourse Parent Module on August 22nd. Please be advised that student schedules will not be available if enrollment update is not complete by the end of the day on **Sunday, August 18th**. Every effort has been made by our school counselors to make an accurate schedule based on a student's academic plan and future goals. All students are to report to their Period 1/Homeroom class by 7:25 am on Thursday, September 5th, 2019. The administration and teaching staff continue to be pleased with the increased communication with both our students and parents due to the Oncourse Parent Module.

Handbook/Rules and Regulations - Ninth grade students and students that are new to the school should spend time carefully reviewing the student handbook. Each year there are changes to the handbook, so we recommend a re-reading of it to those of you who have seen it before. The handbook represents a starting place for information. Feel free to contact appropriate members of the school staff if you need additional information. We will be glad to help you. The Student Handbook is posted on the High School website.

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Class Assemblies- The High School Administration will hold class meetings on the first two days of school. These meetings will serve to inform students of the changes in school rules and policies for the upcoming year. Since attendance will be taken by our first period teachers they will be reviewing school rules and regulations on attendance, discipline, drug and alcohol, fighting, lockers and dress code. I feel that it is extremely important that each student is made aware of the rules and the consequences of violating them. Students will be asked to share the information with you and, given the importance; I suggest that you familiarize yourself with them as well. All of the rules and regulations are outlined in the student handbook.

Entering the Building/Student Drop Off – Parent drop off will be in the front of the building. Please use caution and be certain to obey all local traffic ordinances when dropping off your child. All student belongings will be searched by our security staff and students will be asked to walk through the metal detectors prior to traveling to their morning locations. Each student will be issued an I.D. card. Students must wear their photo ID badge and lanyard at all times. The first ID and one (1) replacement are free. Since ID's are required, the cost of additional replacement ID's is \$5.00. The cost of an addition lanyard is \$3.00. ID's may be obtained at the School Counseling Office. Please see the student handbook for additional guidelines.
